RESPONSE TO SECTION 16 REQUEST FOR FURTHER INFORMATION

Further to your letter dated 17 December 2010 last issued in accordance with Article 16(1) of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations we have herein provided our response to your request for further information and particulars in respect of the proposed inert waste recovery facility at Fassaroe.

1 LICENCE APPLICATION BOUNDARY

Please submit a revised licence application boundary to include the 'supply pond' within the red line boundary.

As requested, we have extended the proposed boundary of the waste licence area to include the existing supply pond immediately south of the concrete production area. Copies of revised application drawings showing the amended waste licence area are attached under cover of this letter.

2 WATER ABSTRACTION

Please submit the following information

 A description of the circumstances under which abstraction of water from the Cookstown River would recommence.

Roadstone Wood will not abstract water from the Cookstown River in the future.

• The nature of the authorisation, if any, that was required for previous abstraction

The Local Government (Water Pollution) Acts (1977-1990) require Local Authorities to maintain a register of water abstractions in their administrative areas. There is currently no legal or administrative provision in Irish law which obliges individuals or businesses to apply for, or obtain, a licence to regulate water abstraction activity.

• The nature of the authorisation that would be required for future abstraction should it recommence

As stated above, Roadstone Wood will not abstract water from the Cookstown River in the future.

A figure for the previous abstraction rate

Roadstone Wood estimates that when sand processing was undertaken at Fassaroe, the average daily abstraction rate was of the order of 90m³/day.

An estimation of the future abstraction rate

As stated above, Roadstone Wood will not abstract water from the Cookstown River in the future.

 An estimation of the future abstraction rate as a percentage of dry weather flow in the river.

As Roadstone Wood will not abstract water from the Cookstown River in the future, the abstraction rate will be 0% of dry weather flow in the river.

• An assessment of the impact that any future abstraction would have on the Cookstown River.

As Roadstone Wood will not abstract water from the Cookstown River in the future, there will be no impact from such activity on the river.

We trust that the additional information provided adequately addresses the issues raised in your letter and that you will shortly be in a position to issue a proposed determination on this waste licence application.
