Dear Mr McCarron,

I am to refer to the above referenced application for a waste licence relating to a facility at Monopower Limited, Killicarran, Emyvale, County Monaghan.

Having examined the documentation submitted, including your legal advice with respect to the classification of wastes, I am to advise that the Agency is of the view that the use of chicken litter and spent mushroom compost for the generation of energy as outlined in your application does not require a licence in accordance with the Waste Management Acts 1996 to 2010.


However, as the proposal would involve the operation of a combustion installation with a rated thermal input greater than 50MW, the activity will require a licence under Class 2.1 of the First Schedule of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2007.

Having regard to the information above, you should notify the Agency within one month of the date of this letter if you intend to withdraw your application for a Waste Licence (Regulation 21(1) WMA Regs 2004 as amended) and reapply for a licence under Class 2.1 of the First Schedule of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2007.

In the absence of a response by the date specified above the Agency will consider that you have abandoned the application (Regulation 21(2) WMA Regs 2004 as amended).
