3. **Objection to a Proposed Decision on an Application for a Waste Licence**

The Directors considered the following documentation: Proposed Decision to refuse to grant a licence issued on 9 December 2010; one First-Party objection received on 13 January 2011; two Third-Party objections received on 12 and 13 January 2011; three Submissions on Objections received on 16 and 17 February 2011; one further first party submission made under article 24 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004 received on 11 March 2011; the report and recommendations of the Technical Committee, Office of Climate, Licensing and Resource Use.

A copy of the licence application was available electronically.

Brian Meaney gave a verbal presentation.

**Technical Committee Report**

The Directors noted the Technical Committee Report and the recommendation of the Committee that the site could be developed as a recovery activity under a waste licence in a manner that would address the reasons for the Proposed Decision. The Directors approved the recommendations of the Technical Committee to grant a licence to the applicant for the reasons outlined in the Recommended Decision, subject to the conditions and reasons for same in the Recommended Decision and subject to amendments proposed by the Technical Committee and the following amendments;

***Introduction***

Amend second sentence of the second paragraph to read; 'A maximum of 24,900 tonnes per annum of waste ... .. level of the site by *one metre* in order ... .. purposes. Delete last sentence of the third paragraph 'The amount of waste soil ... .. cubic metres).'

***Glossary***

Replace 'Regional Fisheries Board' with '*Inland Fisheries Ireland*'. The Directors noted that all the Regional Fisheries Boards were incorporated into Inland Fisheries Ireland in 2010.

***Conditions***

**3.13.4** Amend condition to read; 'The licensee shall ... ..to *Inland Fisheries Ireland* for approval... ..at River sites'.
