Dear Mr Ryan

I am to refer to your incomplete application for an IPPC licence, Reg. No P0915-01 that was received by the Agency on 16 April 2010, under Class 6.2.0: *The rearing of pigs in an installation, whether within the same complex or within 100 metres of the same complex, where the capacity exceeds 2000 places for the production of pigs.* of the First Schedule to the EPA Acts 1992 to 2011.

As you are aware, the Agency assessed your IPPC application for compliance with Article 10 of the EPA (Licensing) Regulations, and on 11th May 2010, a notice was issued to you under Article 8 of the Environmental Protection Agency (Licensing) Regulations 1994 to 2010 requiring that the wording of the site notice and newspaper notice be amended to comply with Article 6 and Article 7 of the Regulations. Following your response to this notice on the 6th January 2011, a further Article 8 notice was issued to you on the 12th January 2011, requiring further amendments to the wording of the site notice and newspaper notice. A response has not been received to this second notice. On the 13th June 2011, the Agency issued a reminder letter to you, indicating that if a response was not received within one month, the Agency may be of the opinion that the application for a licence has been abandoned. A response to this letter has not been received.

The Agency is therefore of the opinion that the application has been abandoned. I enclose a Notice in accordance with Article 24 of the EPA (Licensing) Regulations.

If no submission is received within the time limit the application will be regarded as having been abandoned.

Failure to provide the outstanding information within the time limit will also be regarded as indicating abandonment.

The Agency is empowered to treat the application as abandoned even if a submission is made and/or the documentation furnished. You should therefore treat this notice as one of primary importance and possibly the last opportunity for you to comply with your statutory obligations.

Abandonment of the application may result in prosecution for carrying on an unlicensed activity.
