Dear Mr Ryan

I refer to your application for an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control licence, which was received on 16 April 2010

I am to advise in accordance with Article 11(2)(b)(ii) of the EPA (Licensing) Regulations, that the following information is required in support of the application under Article 10 of the Regulations:

1. With regard to the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) submitted with the licence application on the 16<sup>th</sup> April 2010, provide evidence, where possible, that:
  - a. specifies the planning permission application the EIS was submitted in support of; and,
  - b. demonstrates that the EIS was accepted by the planning authority and considered as part of the planning application assessment.
2. With regard to the EIS submitted to the Agency on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2012, and the planning application made to Limerick County Council on the 20<sup>th</sup> April 2012 (Planning Ref 12/306), please clarify whether you wish the new development to be considered as part of your licence application.

If the new development is to be included in the licence application, please provide the following information:

- a. Clarify the animal capacity (farrowing sows, dry sows, boars, gilts, weaners and fatteners) of the expanded development and the animal numbers (farrowing sows, dry sows, boars, gilts, weaners and fatteners) that will be housed on site.
- b. Provide an expected timeframe within which the site will be ready to accommodate the increased pig numbers and/or submit a copy of the planning authority's notice of decision on the planning application.

**Note:** Any *telephone enquiries* in relation to the above should be directed to **Pamela McDonnell** at the number above.  
All *written communications and replies* should be directed to Grainne Oglesby, Office

- c. Update the site boundary map where necessary, providing a new reference number for any new drawing.
- d. Provide details of the slurry/manure storage capacity (in cubic meters, including deductions for freeboard) which will be available on-site to accommodate the increased quantity of slurry/manure produced.
- e. Update the Fertiliser Plan (and associated documentation) as necessary to demonstrate adequate recovery capacity for the increased quantity of slurry/manure produced.
- f. Outline the expected annual usage of animal feed, electricity, heating oil and water which will be used on site following the expansion.
- g. Highlight any changes to the surface water management system and the quality of the surface water, which may occur as a result of the new development.

In addition to the above please also provide an updated non-technical summary to reflect the information provided in your reply.

The requested information should be submitted to the Agency within *1 month* of the date of this notice, in order to allow the Agency to process and determine your application.

In the circumstances, you should make immediate arrangements to have the required document(s) (1 signed original and 1 copy in hardcopy format, and 2 copies of all files in electronic searchable PDF format on CD-ROM) submitted to the Agency without delay. Your response to this request should be directed to Grainne Oglesby, Administration Officer, Office of Climate, Licensing & Resource use.

It should be noted that the eight-week period within which the Agency is to decide the proposed determination will commence on the day on which this notice has been complied with. If you have any further queries please contact Ms Pamela McDonnell at the number above.
