To the licensing officer,

We would like to make a submission regarding the planning permission amendments currently being sought by Indaver for incinerator in Duleek, dated the 30th of April 2012.

As a grain growers group, any changes to existing practises of any business in our area are reviewed by us. As an entity we would like to submit the following considerations and arguments.

- 1. 20,000 tonnes increase in annual throughput
 Effect of this additional traffic carrying to unit and the actual affect
 this additional output burning would have on an already tenuous
 situation.
- 2. The inclusion of additional European Waste Codes for Hazardous and Non Hazardous waste

What evidence and research has been done on the impact of dealing with these wastes especially with regard to farming. As farmers we ourselves already face restrictions and limitations in the husbandry of our crops, we have to object strongly to Indaver changing their waste procedures.

3. The amendment time to acceptance of this waste

The increased traffic and change of times will have a serious affect on the local community as a whole, but adds additional traffic to an already busy road, there is no provision for the existing traffic to leave the Indaver site promptly without causing traffic queues. Indaver want to add further congestion at more peak commuter times.

4. Unrestricted hours for the dispatch of residues from site "Unrestricting any practice will only allow for abuse of this practise.

We are limited in our resources to make a submission of high technical detail. But we clearly have to make our submission and objections be documented. Indaver Ireland always stated that they would only burn 'non hazardous waste streams', yet once planning permission was granted and the plant successfully functioning, they wish to change their protocol and process.

Now that Indaver is established, it would appear to have an easier route to change their existing planning with minimum awareness by the public.
