 - 0.60 for installations in operation and permitted in accordance with applicable Community acts before 1 January 2009,
 - 0.65 for installations permitted after 31 December 2008,

using the following formula, applied in accordance with the reference document on Best Available Techniques for Waste Incineration:

Energy efficiency = (Ep - (Ef + Ei)/(0.97x(Ew+Ef))

where -

- 'Ep' means annual energy produced as heat or electricity calculated with energy in the form of electricity being multiplied by 2.6 and heat produced for commercial use multiplied by 1.1(GJ/year),
 - 'Ef' means annual energy input to the system from fuels contributing to the production of steam (GJ/year),
 - 'Ew' means annual energy contained in the treated waste calculated using the net calorific value of the waste (GJ/year),
 - 'Ei' means annual energy imported excluding Ew and Ef(GJ/year),
 - '0.97' is a factor accounting for energy losses due to bottom ash and radiation.
- R 2 Solvent reclamation/regeneration
- <u>R 3</u> Recycling/reclamation of organic substances which are not used as solvents (including composting and other biological transformation processes), which includes gasification and pyrolisis using the components as chemicals
- <u>R 4</u> Recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds
- <u>R 5</u> Recycling/reclamation of other inorganic materials, which includes soil cleaning resulting in recovery of the soil and recycling of inorganic construction materials
