Content of Environmental Impact Statement

I am to advise in accordance with Regulation 11(2)(b) of the Environmental Protection Agency (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013, that the EIS does not comply with Article 94 of the Planning and Development Regulations, or with any provision amending or replacing the said article 94.

The Agency, in fulfilling its duty under Section 83(2A)(f) of the EPA Acts, as amended, requests the following information to be submitted to the Agency by 5 November 2013:

- 1. An assessment of potential impacts on materials assets and climate.
- 2. An assessment of the potentially significant impact interactions due to the proposed remediation activities. Include a matrix of the potentially significant impact interactions due to the proposed activities in the form of a table.

In addition to the above please also provide an updated non-technical summary to reflect the information provided in your reply.

Further Information

In accordance with Regulation 13(1) of the Environmental Protection Agency (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013, you are requested to supply the following additional information.

1. In relation to the permitting of direct discharges to groundwater, which is facilitated by Regulation 8 of the European Communities Environmental Objectives (Ground Water) Regulations (S.I. No. 9 of 2010), confirm the discharge that is applicable to the proposed remediation works. The direct discharges that can be permitted are listed in Regulation 8(b)((i) to (vi) of the Groundwater Regulations.

Please submit the information as 1 signed original, 1 hard copy and 2 copies in electronic searchable PDF format on CD-ROM.
