NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in accordance with the provisions of the Waste Management Acts (1996-2013) and Articles 5 and 6 of the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations, 2004 (S.I. No. 395 of 2004), that Lennon Quarries Ltd., Glencastle, Bunnahowen, Ballina, Co. Mayo, have applied to the Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) for a Review of their Waste Licence W0256-01, for the recovery of soil and stone, on their site at Tallagh, Belmullet, Co. Mayo, which is located at National Grid Reference E469825 N835770.

In accordance with Section 42 (11)(b) of the Waste Management Act (1996-2013), as inserted by the European Union (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Waste) Regulations 2013 (S.I. No. 505 of 2013), the Agency has requested the applicant to submit an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), in support of the Waste Licence Review Application. The EIS will be submitted to the Agency as part of the Waste Licence Review Application.

The works proposed by the Waste Licence Review Application involve the acceptance of 90,000 tonnes per annuar of soil and stone and their recovery, by spreading the material over the site area, with a consequential benefit for improving the land for agricultural use. There is no proposed charge to the final levels of the site, as currently licensed, under Waste Licence W0256-01.

The relevant Waste Recovery Operations, as per the Fourth Schedule of the Waste Management Act (1996–2013) and the Waste Management (Licensing) Regulations 2004 (S.I. No. 395 of 2004) to which this application relates are:

The Principle Operation to be carried out at the site:

Fourth Schedule - Waste Recovery Operation - R5 "Recycling/reclamation of other Inorganic Materials, which includes soil cleaning resulting in recovery of the soil and recycling of inorganic construction materials"

Other Operation to be carried out at the site:

Fourth Schedule - Waste Recovery Operation – R13 "Storage of Waste pending any of the operations numbered R1 to R12 (excluding temporary storage (being preliminary storage according to the definition of 'collection' in section 5(1)), pending collection, on the site where the waste is produced)"
