Woodville Pig Farms Limited requests a review of its IPPC Licence as advised in your letter dated 30th October, 2012.

The main item to be the subject of this review is the issue of stock numbers. It has always been the intention of Woodville Pig Farms Limited to increase the stock numbers at the breeding site. All of the existing buildings at the Breeding Unit in Woodville townland have planning permission. A new planning permission was lodged with North Tipperary County Council to increase the pig numbers as shown below in Column 3 of Table 1. The total number of pigs currently accommodated on the site is shown in Column 2 of Table 1 below:
