I refer to your letter dated 20th January 2012 requesting a review of your existing IPPC licence (Reg. No. P0412-01 in accordance with Article 15 of the Environmental Protection Agency (Licensing) Regulations.

I am to advise that based on the information provided the Agency has determined that a review of your licence (Reg. No. P0412-01 is necessary and that an application for a review should be submitted to the Agency in accordance with Section 90(1)(b) of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2011. This review is necessary in the light of:

Your proposal to convert from a breeding unit to an integrated unit.

You should note that it will be the entire IPPC licence that will be subject to the review and the application and any submission should be prepared on this basis.

For the purposes of this review you are required to use the Agency's application form. The Application form is available to download from the Agency's website: <u>http://www.epa.ie/downloads/forms/lic/ippc/</u>. In particular you are required to include the following information:

- the maximum number of animals to be housed on-site (sows, gilts, production pigs etc.), having regard to the IPPC Directive definition of sow (including gilts following service) and production pig;
- an assessment of the impact of discharges/emissions from the activity; and
- consideration of Best Available Techniques for the activity.

I should also advise that in accordance with section 87(1)(a) of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2011 you are required to do the following:

o Notify, in writing, the planning authority in whose functional area the activity is or will be situated, that an application is to be made to the Agency for the review of your existing. licence or a revised licence under section 90 of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2011. Please forward a copy of this notification to the Agency with the information requested above, and;

publish a notice advising that an application is to be made to the Agency for a review of your existing licence in a newspaper circulating in the district in which the activity is situated. You are requested to publish this notice within the period of two weeks before the submission of your application. Please forward a copy of this publication to the Agency with the information requested above.

All information and data should be submitted in the following format one original, 1 hard copies and 2 copies on CD-ROM in electronic searchable PDF format.

I am also to advise that your application is to be accompanied by the appropriate fee (as outlined in the EPA Licensing (Fees) Regulations).

APPLICATION TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE REVIEW OF A LICENCE

-class or classes and nature of the activity in accordance with the First Schedule of the Act,

-where the application is required to be accompanied by an environmental impact statement in accordance with this Part—

(i) A statement will be submitted to the Agency with the application,

(ii) state that the environmental impact statement, and any further information relating to the effects on the environment of the emissions from the activity which may be furnished to the Agency in the course of the Agency's consideration of the application, will be available at the headquarters of the Agency, and

(iii) the name of the planning authority to which a copy of the environmental impact statement has been, or will be, submitted, and

-that a copy of the application for the licence may be inspected at or obtained from the headquarters of the Agency as soon as is practicable after the receipt by the Agency of the application for the licence.
