

Re: IPPC Licence for Timoleague Agri Gen Limited (P0986-01)

Dear Ms. Keavey,

I refer to your recent correspondence concerning the above.

In addition to the proposed revised IPPC Licence to be issued by the Environmental Protection Agency, the operations proposed on the site and the receipt/discharge of waste materials shall be regulated, as appropriate, by the following:

- Animal By-Products Regulations Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009 and Commission Regulation (EC) No. 142/2011. Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009 repealed Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1774/2002. The Biogas Facility is subject to the requirements of the Department of Agriculture's Animal By-products Regulations S.I. No 252 of 2008, as amended by S.I. No. 291 of 2009 and S.I. No 345 of 2009.
- The construction of all organic waste storage structures and pipe-works is subject to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine Farm Building and Structures Specifications.
- Regulations and Guidelines pursuant to the Nitrates Directive 91/676/EEC, the Water Framework Directive 2000/60/EC and Groundwater Directives 2006/118/EC. as implemented by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine.
- SI No. 31 of 2014 European Union (Good Agricultural Practice for Protection of Waters) Regulations 2014. Please note that SI 610 of 2010 Regulations have been revoked, therefore any supplementary information submitted to the EPA in support of the IPPC Licence should be updated to reflect compliance with S.I. No. 31 of 2014.
