AA Screening Determination:

That the activity is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of the site as a European site and that it cannot be excluded, on the basis of objective information, that the activity, individually or in combination with other plans or projects will have a significant effect on a European site and accordingly determined that an Appropriate Assessment of the activity is required, and for this reason **determined to require the applicant to submit a Natura Impact Statement.** The reasons for the determination are; the discharge of untreated effluent from the agglomeration directly to Cork Harbour SPA, the Water Framework Directive (WFD) status of the receiving water is 'Moderate' and monitoring of the receiving water indicates that the discharge is having an impact for Dissolved Inorganic Nitrogen.
