You are hereby requested, pursuant to Regulation 13(2)(a) of the *Environmental Protection Agency (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013*, to submit to the Agency the documents, particulars and information specified in the Schedule to this notice within **twelve weeks** beginning on the date of the giving of this notice.

In the circumstances, you should make immediate arrangements to have the required document(s) (1 signed original and 1 copy in hardcopy format, and 2 copies of all files in electronic searchable PDF format on CD-ROM) submitted to the Agency without delay.

## Schedule

You are required to carry out the steps and provide the information set out below:

1. Review the amended First Schedule to the EPA Act and specify the class or classes of activity at the installation. Provide a full description as outlined in the Act.
2. Tabulate any relevant conclusions on BAT from the following BREF documents:
  - Reference Document on Best Available Techniques for Large Combustion Plants, July 2006.
  - Reference Document on Best Available Techniques for Energy Efficiency, February 2009
  - Reference Document on Best Available Techniques on Emissions from Storage, July 2006

Any other relevant conclusions on BAT should also be tabulated. The following details should also be included in your tables:

- For each conclusion on BAT, state if it is proposed to be put in place and the timeline for implementation. Details of any proposals must be provided.
  - Where you do not propose to meet the requirements of a particular BAT conclusion, provide reasons and a justification.
3. Where an activity involves the use, production or release of relevant hazardous substances (as defined in Section 3 of the EPA Act) and having regard to the possibility of soil and groundwater contamination at the site of the installation, provide a baseline report in accordance with Section 86B of the EPA Act 1992 as amended and the *European Commission Guidance concerning baseline reports under Article 22(2) of Directive 2010/75/EU on industrial emissions (2014/C 136/03)*.
  4. Describe the arrangement for the prevention of waste in accordance with Part III of the Waste Management Acts 1996, as amended. Describe what measures will be taken to prevent the generation of waste to the extent possible.
