AA Screening Determination:

That the activity is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of the site as a European site and that it can be excluded, on the basis of objective information, that the activity, individually or in combination with other plans or projects will have a significant effect on a European site, and accordingly the Agency determined that an Appropriate Assessment of the activity was not required.

This determination is based on the consistent high quality of the effluent discharged from the agglomeration and the distance from the primary discharge to the European sites. In addition, the receiving water downstream of the primary discharge (Dissour River (IE_SW_19_1798)) is classified as having good water quality status under the Water Framework Directive, thereby minimising the potential of significant effects on water dependent qualifying interests of the European sites.
