Dear Mr Luby

The EPA has recently issued a Waste licence for your facility Huntstown Inert Waste Recovery Facility at Huntstown Quarry, Finglas, Dublin 11. The EPA is writing to inform you that it is the responsibility of Roadstone Wood Limited, as the licensee, under Condition 11 of the licence, to ensure that notifications, records and reports are submitted to the EPA in accordance with the requirements of the licence.

The EPA enforces all licences through an online web based system and has largely removed the need for paper based communication. Therefore, in order to facilitate the prompt and efficient enforcement of your licence you are now required to contact the EPA without delay at aldersupport@epa.ie supplying the following information:

- As a minimum, the name and email address for the primary contact for your facility in relation to enforcement of your licence.
- The Agency strongly recommends that contact information is also supplied for a secondary and tertiary contact.

The licensee shall then be issued with a *username* and *password* for logging into this web based system; through which enforcement of the licence and communication with the EPA will largely be based. The primary, secondary and tertiary contacts will be the persons notified of any correspondence/notifications from the EPA.


The management and communication of any incidents to the EPA shall be in accordance with the EPA's Guidance;

All incidents must now be reported via the ALDER electronic communications web portal.


