## **INTERACTIONS 14**

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## INTRODUCTION

- 14.1 All of the reasonably predictable significant impacts of the proposed development and the measures proposed to mitigate them have been outlined in this EIS. However, for any development with the potential for significant environmental impact there is also the potential for interaction amongst these impacts. The result of these interactions may either exacerbate the magnitude of the impact or ameliorate it. The interaction of impacts on the surrounding environment needs to be addressed as part of the Environmental Impact Assessment process.
- 14.2 This Environmental Impact Statement was edited and collated by SLR Consulting on behalf of Roadstone Limited as an integrated document, rather than a collection of separate reports. The impacts that arise as a result of the interaction between several aspects of the development have therefore been addressed in the main body of each EIS section.

## **Interactions**

The interaction between the various sections of the EIS has been addressed separately in Chapters 3 to 13 of the EIS. These interactions are summarised in Table 14-1 overleaf:
