4. **Objection to Proposed Decision of an Application for a Waste Licence**

The Directors considered the following documentation: Proposed Decision issued on 26 May 2017; one Third-Party objection; one First Party submission on the objection; and the Report and recommendations of the Technical Committee, Office of Environmental Sustainability.

A copy of the licence application was available electronically.

Marie O’Connor gave a verbal presentation.

Technical Committee Report

The Directors noted the Technical Committee Report and approved the recommendations of the Technical Committee with the following amendments to the Proposed Decision:

Introduction

Amend the second paragraph to read as follows: ‘This waste licence relates to the operation of an inert waste recovery facility at Huntstown Quarry, Huntstown, Kilshane and Johnstown Townlands, Finglas, Dublin 11, by Roadstone Limited. The activity relates to *the deposition for the purposes of quarry restoration* of an exhausted quarry void using imported natural soil and stone. The annual intake of waste to be used to backfill the quarry is 1,500,000 tonnes.

Amend the third paragraph to read as follows: ‘The licence requires the development and implementation of waste acceptance criteria and inspection procedures to ensure that only suitable soil and stone is used for *deposition for the purposes of quarry restoration*. The licence specifies a number of environmental controls in order to minimise the risk of environmental pollution and nuisance to the public arising from the activities at the facility. The environmental monitoring requirements include monitoring of discharge to adjacent stream, groundwater quality and ambient dust and noise.

Following discussion, the Directors decided to grant a licence, as modified, to Roadstone Limited, for their facility at Huntstown Quarry, Kilshane and Johnstown Townlands,

Finglas, Dublin 11, Register of Licence No W0277-02, subject to the conditions as set out in the licence.
