9. **Recommended Decision on an Application for a Waste Licence**

The Directors considered a recommendation from the Office of Environmental Sustainability that the Agency approve the Recommended Decision to grant a Waste Licence. The following documentation was submitted: Recommended Decision; and Report of the Inspector dated 26 April 2018.

Inspector's Report

Recommended Decision

Introduction

Amend the second sentence of the second paragraph to read as follows: 'A maximum of 500 tonnes of hazardous waste will be accepted at the facility.'

Conditions

- 8.7** Amend the condition to read as follows: '~~Other than blending or mixing waste refrigerant gases or reclaimed refrigerant gases,~~ The licensee is prohibited from mixing a hazardous waste of one category with a hazardous waste of another category or with any other non-hazardous waste.'

Schedule A: Limitations

Table A.1 Waste Categories and Quantities

Amend Table A1 to state that 'The site can accept only Waste refrigerant gas accepted from approved **refrigerant** contractors and Waste Refrigerant Cooling Fluids.'

Delete Code 16 05 09 from the table.

Schedule C: Control & Monitoring

C.1.2 Monitoring of Emissions to Air

Amend the first column Parameter as follows: 'Characterisation of vent gases including constituent inorganic and organic compounds (including hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs), sulfur hexafluoride (SF6) and nitrogen trifluoride (NF3); and chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) hydrochlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs) halons carbon tetrachloride and methyl bromide.'

Following discussion, the Directors decided to grant a licence, as modified, to Harp Refrigerants Limited, for their facility at Unit 2, Whitestown Industrial Estate, Whitestown Road, Tallaght, Dublin 24, Register of Licence No W0297-01, subject to the conditions as set out in the licence.
