## Appendix 1- Licence Enforcement and Communication with the EPA

In order to facilitate the prompt and efficient enforcement of your license you are now required to contact the EPA without delay at <a href="mailto:edensupport@epa.ie">edensupport@epa.ie</a> supplying the following information:

- As a minimum, the name and email address for the primary contact for your facility in relation to enforcement of your license.
- The Agency strongly recommends that contact information is also supplied for a secondary and tertiary contact.

The licensee shall then be issued with a *username* and *password* for logging into this web based system; through which enforcement of the licence and communication with the EPA will largely be based. The primary, secondary and tertiary contacts will be the persons notified of any correspondence/notifications from the EPA.

The management and communication of any incidents to the EPA shall be in accordance with the EPA's Guidance; "Guidance on the Notification Management and Communication of Environmental Incidents" which can be accessed at:

All incidents must now be reported via the EDEN electronic communications web portal.
