Application to the Environmental Protection Agency for a Waste Licence

GLV Bay Lane Limited gives notice that a waste licence is being sought in respect of a proposed inert soil and stone waste recovery activity on lands at Bay Lane Quarry, Bay Lane, County Dublin. National Grid Reference, E 309667 N 243057.

The proposal is to restore a quarry to a contoured landform that will be in keeping with the surrounding landscape and with previous site condition. The proposed lifetime input volume is approximately 740,000 m³. Estimated lifetime of the operation is approximately 30 months. Proposed input materials are inert soil and stones for site restoration. Only input materials that have been pre-screened to demonstrate exclusion of non-inert soil and stone will be accepted at the facility. Temporary stockpiling of topsoil and subsoil is proposed. Site plant will include a bulldozer, loading shovel, weighbridge, wheel-wash and temporary site offices.

The proposed classes of activity, as per the Fourth Schedule the Waste Management Act 1996 are:

- (Principal activity) R5 Recycling/reclamation of other inorganic materials, which includes soil cleaning resulting in recovery of the soil and recycling of inorganic construction materials.
- R13 Storage of waste pending any of the operations numbered R1 to R12 (excluding temporary storage (being preliminary storage according to the definition of 'collection' in section 5(1)), pending collection, on the site where the waste is produced).

A copy of the application for a waste licence, the environmental impact assessment report, and such further information relating to the application as may be furnished to the Agency in the course of the Agency's consideration will, as soon as is practicable after receipt by the Agency, be available for of the For in spectros inspection or purchase at the headquarters of the Agency.
