Dear Sir/Madam

Re: Withdrawal by Irish Water of Waste Water Discharge Licence Application in respect of the agglomeration named Grenagh, Reg. No. D0544-01

I refer to previous correspondence in relation to the above referenced Waste Water Discharge Licence application.

I am to advise that Irish Water formally withdrew their application for a Waste Water Discharge Licence for the Grenagh agglomeration on 17 December 2018, on the basis that the agglomeration size is less than 500 population equivalent (p.e.) and therefore the current Certificate of Authorisation (A0524-01) is the appropriate form of authorisation for the waste water discharges from the Grenagh agglomeration.

The Agency formally acknowledged the withdrawal on 18 July 2019. That being the case, it is no longer the function of the Agency to consider any documentation received by it which relates to the above application.
