APPLICATION TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR A WASTE LICENCE

South Dublin County Council of County Hall, Tallaght, Dublin 24 intends to apply to the Environmental Protection Agency for a retrospective Waste Licence to retain the existing soil recovery facility on the grounds of Grange Castle Golf Club, New Nangor Road, Clondalkin, Dublin 22, D22 WY66 (National Grid Reference, E304670 N229871).

During October 2007 and May 2009 an estimated 325,000 tonnes of construction waste was imported to sections of the golf club from various sources to provide a mounding around the perimeter of the course and between fairways. The purpose of this application is to regularise the site as a soil recovery facility in accordance with the Waste Management Act, 1996 (as amended). The proposal is for the material to remain *in situ*, with no construction works required and there is no proposed removal of the imported materials from the site. There is no proposed movement of the materials onsite in any way and no further importation of material to the site will take place.

The sole class of activity, as per the Fourth Schedules the Waste Management Act 1996, as amended, is Class R5 - recycling/reclamation of other inorganic materials, which includes soil cleaning resulting in recovery of the soil and recycling of inorganic construction materials.

An environmental impact assessment report will be submitted to the Agency with the waste licence application.

A copy of the application for a waste licence, the environmental impact assessment report, and such further information relating to the application as may be furnished to the Agency in the course of the Agency's consideration will, as soon as is practicable after receipt by the Agency, be available for inspection or purchase at the headquarters of the Agency.
