Background

Licence Reg No W0238-01 was granted to Dublin City Council on the 21/05/2008. A Transfer Application was received on 28/07/2020 from Dublin City Council and Starrus Eco Holdings Limited. According to the applicants the basis for the transfer application is Starrus Eco Holdings Ltd have been operating the site since 2012. The transfer of licence will allow Starrus Eco Holdings Limited to operate the installation, currently operating at Merrywell Industrial Estate, Ballymount Road Lower, Ballymount, Dublin 12, under Licence Reg No W0238-01.

The Agency is informed that Starrus Eco Holdings Limited is a limited incorporated company under the laws of Ireland and registered in the Companies Registration Office (Registered Number 527552).

Starrus Eco Holdings Ltd (Panda) currently operate a total of 18 licenced facilities, two landfill licenses and three permitted facilities in Ireland, located throughout the country.

Assessment

The application was assessed under Section 94 of the Environmental Protection Agency Act 1992 as amended. It is deemed to comply with the requirements of the above, as follows:

Requirements of Section 94(2) and 94(3)

The application complies with Subsection (2) having been jointly made by the current licensee and the proposed transferee.

The application was made in the form prescribed by the Agency.

The application was accompanied by the appropriate fee, in accordance with Regulation 5 of the EPA (Licensing Fees) Regulations.

Such information as may be required by Section 94(3)

Any costs associated with the closure plan (CRAMP) of the installation have been fully detailed by the licensee and have been approved by the Office of Environmental Enforcement (OEE).

Any costs associated with any environmental event (ELRA, etc.) at the installation have been fully detailed by the licensee and have been approved by OEE.

The transferee or any relevant person has not had an application for a licence refused.

Requirements of Section 94(5)

Information in relation to the status of the proposed transferee as a 'Fit and Proper Person' has been provided and, based on a review of the information; the proposed transferee has no relevant convictions and has sufficient technical experience and support.

In relation to Financial Provision, a Bond and Insurance has been provided for Starrus Eco Holdings Limited. This Financial Provision has been agreed with the Office of Environmental Enforcement.

The Senior Programme Officer (ELP) has reviewed the transfer application and considers, on the basis of the information provided in the application, that the proposed transferee can be deemed a Fit & Proper Person for the purpose of this transfer.

Requirements of Section 94(6)

The proposed transferee has stated in writing that they accept all liabilities, requirements and obligations provided for in or arising under the licence regardless of how and in respect of what period, including a period prior to the transfer of a licence, that may arise.

OEE confirmed on 4 August 2020 that no outstanding legal issues required to be resolved.

Finance Unit confirmed on 28 July 2020 that no outstanding fees were due from the licensee.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the transfer of Industrial Emissions licence Reg. No. W0238-01 from Dublin City Council to Starrus Eco Holdings Limited, CRO No 527552, is approved under Section 94 of the Environmental Protection Agency Act 1992 as amended.
