Dear Mr. Ryder,

As a person who is qualified, trained and experienced to the standard set out in section 2.3 of Code of Practice: Environmental Rick Assessment for Unregulated Waste Disposal Sites (EPA, 2007), it is my opinion that the risk assessment carried out by Galway County Council in relation to a closed landfill at Tullyvogheen, Clifden, County Galway is adequate and complete.

The risk assessment complies with all of the requirements of the Code of Practice. The local authority or its agent/contractor, in carrying out the risk assessment, has followed and completed the steps set out in the Code of Practice and associated guidance (Matrix 1 and Matrix 2 – as published).
