Dear Aisling,

I am writing in response to your letter dated 9th February 2021 request for information. I have the following points to make-

- We do not have Article 16 Response dated 21<sup>st</sup> May 1999 (including Table E.1.3) document to hand. I would like to request this document from the EPA archives.
- Our request is not the same as May 2020. We are now requesting a derogation to our licence to allow temporary storage of clinical waste at the above address.
- The waste codes listed below are the ones we wish to include in this request. 180101: waste arising from care, diagnosis, treatment or prevention of disease in humans 180101: sharps 180103\*: waste whose collection and disposal is subject to requirements to prevent infection 180108\*: cytotoxic and cytostatic medicines 180110\*: dental amalgam

As previously stated, clinical waste volumes have increased dramatically with the current situation. As you are aware SRCL is the only facility in Ireland that accept this waste. At the moment delivery vehicles have to wait up to 5-7 hours to dispose of waste on a daily basis. This is causing massive disruption to our customers. Therefore, this request for a temporary derogation to our licence is a matter of urgency to help alleviate waiting times at SRCL and continue to service our customers without disruptions.
