The Cork Lower Harbour WwTW have been designed to ensure that the emissions from the agglomeration will comply with, and will not result in the contravention of, EU Directives and National Regulations. The new WwTP has been designed to operate in compliance with existing legislative and regulatory standards (secondary treatment provided). The new WwTP and network works will end the practice of discharging untreated primary wastewater discharges into Cork Harbour which will improve the water quality of the harbour and help ensure environmental compliance.
