Notice for Public Consultation on Appropriate Assessment under Regulation 42 of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended

The EPA on 31st March 2022 issued an Appropriate Assessment Screening Determination to Longford County Council for a closed landfill located at Ballymulvey, Ballymahon, County Longford, in the townland of Ballymulvey, regarding an application for a certificate of authorisation, Register Number H0296-01.

The application is for a certificate of authorisation, including remedial measures required, at the above referenced closed landfill. The closed landfill site covers an area of 4.3 hectare. Disposal of waste at the site was carried out from c.1965 to c.1995. Approximately 135,000 tonnes of waste was deposited at the site. The waste comprises of municipal waste, construction & demolition (C&D) waste and industrial waste.

The EPA has carried out an Appropriate Assessment Screening and has determined that an Appropriate Assessment is required for the activity.

Submissions or observations on Appropriate Assessment concerning a certificate of authorisation application can be made in writing to the Agency. Such submissions or observations may be made for at least 30 days after publication of the following information on the Agency's website:

Information on making submissions or observations and on the public participation process is available on the Agency's website.

The EPA shall publish its draft certificate of authorisation on its website, and before making a final decision, the EPA shall consider any representations submitted in accordance with the Waste Management (Certification of Historic Unlicensed Waste Disposal and Recovery Activity) Regulations 2008. The final decision will also be published on the website.
