Cork County Council has taken a total of 8no samples at Garryvoe beach during the 2022 bathing season. Of these, 7no samples were noted as being 'excellent' while the remaining 1no sample was determined to be 'good'. The proposed Ballycotton WwTP will provide primary treatment of wastewater, with treated effluent quality achieving 20% reduction in BOD and 50% reduction in Suspended Solids. The reduction in Suspended Solids will result in a decrease in pathogens in the discharge and will therefore not have any negative effects on the bathing water quality at Garryvoe. As the proposed Scheme does not come within the specified classes, there is no mandatory requirement for an EIA for the proposed Scheme. In addition to the above, a sub threshold assessment has been undertaken. The potential for impacts has been identified, both positive and negative but none that
