Site Condition Report

Carhue Piggerries Ltd facility involves the rearing of pigs (EPA licence P0621-02) located in Cooligboy, Timoleague, Bandon, Co Cork. The activity has been operational since the early 1990s and falls under the threshold specified in Annex 1 of the Integrated Pollution Prevention + Control (IPPC) Directive and the First Schedule of the EPA Acts 1992 to 2007.

Installations for the intensive rearing of pigs with more than (a) 750 places for sows and (b) 2000 places for production pigs which are over 30kg.

Ground water Monitoring On- Site

Potable water is sourced via two onsite well (AGW1 and AGW2) to which is monitored Annually under Schedule 3 (ii) of the current EPA licence P0621-02. Below are the average results from 2022 which are within the normal range for these parameters, and don't indicate any negative influence from the site facility. These results will continue to be reviewed against future analysis results, for any indicative changes. It is company policy to ensure compliance with the requirements of the EC Environmental objectives (Groundwater) Regulations 2010, S.I. No 9 of 2010.

Environmental Record

There has been no record of any spill however there was minor incident on site in 2016 which was dealt with promptly that would result in environmental contamination and the site is maintained in a clean and tidy manner. The Licensee has an overall good compliance history since the licence was granted. However, since Mid-2021 there has been several site visits from Enforcement in relation to unauthorised activities outside the current license site boundary to which the purpose of this review is to address the issues raised by enforcement.

There are currently no compliances ongoing on this site and any non-compliances identified in site visits are delt with by the licensee in a timely manner.
