Dear Sir,

I refer to your application for a licence review in respect of the agglomeration named Midleton.

I am to advise you in accordance with Regulation 42(8)(a) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended, that the EPA has made a determination that an Appropriate Assessment is required as the project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, is likely to have a significant effect on European sites. Notification of this determination is attached for your reference. The EPA acknowledges receipt of a Natura Impact Statement, submitted on 18/07/2023.

In carrying out an Appropriate Assessment the EPA shall take into account each of the matters specified in Regulation 42(12) of the European Communities (Birds and Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended, where applicable.

The EPA shall publish a Notice for Public Consultation on Appropriate Assessment under Regulation 42 of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended.

AA Screening Determination:

That the waste water discharges are not directly connected with or necessary to the management of any European site and that it cannot be excluded, on the basis of objective information, that the waste water discharges individually or in combination with other plans or projects, will have a significant effect on any European site and accordingly determined that an Appropriate Assessment of the waste water discharges is required. The EPA acknowledges receipt of a Natura Impact Statement, submitted on 18/07/2023.

The determination is based on the potential for impacts from the waste water discharges on the water dependent qualifying habitat and species of the Great Island Channel SAC and Cork Harbour SPA. The proposed discharges are directly into these European Sites and are hydrologically connected with the qualifying interests of the Sites.
