Further Notice under the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013, in respect of a licence review from Starrus Eco Holdings Limited for an installation located at Millennium Business Park, Grange, Ballycoolin, Dublin 11

Dear Sir and Madam,

I refer to the EPA's notice of 20th November 2023 requesting information in respect of your licence review application.

You are advised that there remains outstanding information, as required under the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013, as amended. You are therefore required to submit the outstanding information detailed below:

Regulation 9(4)(e) of the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013 requires the appropriate fee as per the schedule of fees to be submitted with the application. It is noted that the outstanding sum of €15,000 has not been received. The balance of €15,000 should be submitted to the Agency by cheque or Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT). ***Please arrange for the outstanding balance to be paid and provide evidence of payment in response to this letter.***

As previously advised under Regulation 8 of the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013 requires a notice to be provided to the relevant planning authority regarding an application made to the Agency for a licence. The copy of notice you submitted on the 20th December 2023 did not include all the relevant information. You are therefore requested, to re-submit the letter to the relevant planning authority regarding an application made to the Agency. Please refer to 'Newspaper Notice - Guidance for Applicants' with regard to the information to be contained in the letter to the relevant planning authority, including details of the EIAR submitted.

In addition it is noted that an application for planning permission is under consideration at this time.

1. In accordance with section 87(1B)(b) of the Act of 1992 provide, a copy of the final grant of planning permission together with either:
 1. a copy of the environmental impact assessment (EIA) report (if not already submitted), and any updates relating to EIA required during the application for planning permission process, or
 2. a written confirmation from the planning authority or An Bord Pleanála that an environmental impact assessment was not required by or under the Act of 2000 (if not already submitted).

With a view to advancing this application for determination, the above mentioned information should be submitted to the EPA as soon as possible.
