Regulation 10(2)(b)(ii) of the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulations 2013, in respect of a licence application from Mr. Conor Smith for an installation located at Glenmore, Aughnacliffe, County Longford.

Dear Mr. Fay,

I refer to the application for a licence received by the EPA on 29 April 2024.

Having examined the documentation submitted, I am to advise that the Agency is of the view that the documentation does not comply with the above-mentioned legislation. You are therefore requested, in accordance with the regulations, to supply the information detailed below.

## 1. Site plan:

- a. The site plan provided with the application appears to show the installation boundary encompassing part of a public road. Provide an updated site plan, excluding areas outside the applicant's ownership and control.
- b. Update the site plan to include the location of stormwater discharge point SW-1.

## 2. Water supply:

The application refers to a water supply for the site from an on-farm well.

- a. Clarify if the well is or will be located within the proposed installation boundary;
- b. Provide the grid reference of the well; and
- c. If applicable, update the site plan with the location of the well.

## 3. Wash water:

- a. Clarify the number of wash water tanks that will be located on-site.
- b. Confirm the individual capacity of the wash water tanks that will be on-site (total capacity minus the freeboard).

c. Clarify the total storage capacity that will be available, (total capacity minus the freeboard), and whether 26 weeks' storage capacity will be available onsite and/or off-site. If the storage capacity is to be supplemented by off-site storage, please identify the type, capacity and location of the off-site storage.

In order to assist you in compiling this information, a table has been provided. Complete Table 1 appropriately.

In addition to the above, please also provide an updated non-technical summary (Application Form, and EIAR where applicable) to reflect the information provided in your reply, insofar as that information impinges on the non-technical summary.

The requested information should be submitted to the Agency within **four weeks** of the date of this notice, in order to allow the Agency to process and determine your application.

It should be noted that the eight-week period within which the Agency is to decide the proposed determination will commence on the day on which this notice has been complied with. If you have any further queries please contact <u>licensing@epa.ie</u>.

In the case where any drawings already submitted are subject to revision consequent on this request, a revised drawing should be prepared in each case. It is not sufficient to annotate the original drawing with a textual correction. Where such revised drawings are submitted, provide a list of drawing titles, drawing numbers and revision status, which correlates the revised drawings with the superseded versions.

Your response to this request is to be submitted via EDEN. Guidance on how to use this portal is available on the EPA website at <u>IE Licence application guidance | Environmental</u> <u>Protection Agency (epa.ie).</u>

Note that where the applicant fails to comply with this requirement in full and to the satisfaction of the Agency, the Agency may consider, having regard to the extent of the failure, whether the application can be considered pursuant to Regulation 10(2)(b)(ii) of the Environmental Protection Agency (Industrial Emissions)(Licensing) Regulations 2013 as amended, and may issue a notice in writing that the application cannot be considered by the Agency, outlining the extent of such failure. Alternatively, where there is a failure to comply with this requirement the Agency may activate Regulation 19 of the EPA (Industrial Emissions) (Licensing) Regulation 2013, which pertains to Withdrawal or Abandonment of an application for licence.
